1	Resolution to Permit Expansion of Clinical Faculty Track in Individual
2	Colleges

4 5	Resolved
6	a) that the Senate recommends to the Provost and the President that the Clinical Track
7	Policy (Operations Manual III-10.9) be amended as follows:
8	
9	i) current section III-10.9b(1) will be replaced with the following substitute language:
10	
11	"(1) Salaried appointments. Each college adopting a clinical track policy shall fix the
12	percentage of its total salaried faculty that may hold clinical track appointments without
13	limitation. However, any proposal made at any time to increase the percentage of clinical
14	track appointments within a college (including an initial proposal to create a clinical
15	track) must obtain both the approval of a majority of the tenure/tenure track faculty within
16	the college and the approval of a majority of the clinical track faculty by a referendum
17	supervised by the Associate Provost for Faculty. Any such proposal must also be
18	approved by the Provost."
19	
20	ii) the following language should be added to current section III-10.9h(2)(a):
21	
22	"Policies for the participation of clinical faculty in collegiate faculty governance,
23	including in the hiring of tenure and clinical track faculty, will be developed by each
24	college using its usual governance procedures, provided, however, that no such
25	governance policy shall permit clinical track faculty to vote on the reappointment, tenure
26	or promotion of any tenured or tenure track faculty member."
27	

1	b) that the following amendments be made to the Senate Constitution and Bylaws:
2	
3	i) that Article II, paragraph 2, of the Senate Constitution (Operations Manual I-2.8(2)c(2))
4	be amended to read as follows:
5	
6	"(2) Composition
7	
8	Besides the representatives elected as specified above, who may (except as otherwise
9	provided in this paragraph) hold either tenured, non-tenured, or salaried clinical
10	appointments to the faculty, the Senate also includes eight [probationary] representatives
11	No more than 20% of the senators from any college, or one senator, whichever is
12	greater, may be clinical track faculty of that college."
13	
14	ii) that Article V of the Senate Constitution (Operations Manual I-2.8(2)f) be amended to
15	read as follows:
16	An amendment becomes effective when approved by (1) a majority of those voting in
17	the Senate, (2) a majority of those voting in a faculty referendum, (3) the president of the
18	University, and (4) the Board of Regents, provided, however, that in the case of any
19	amendment to Article II, paragraph 2-regarding the limitation on representation of
20	clinical track faculty to 20% of the representatives from any college-the required vote of
21	the Senate shall be a 3/5 affirmative vote of the entire membership of the Senate, whether
22	or not present at the time of the consideration of the amendment.
23	
24	iii) that Article II of the Bylaws be amended by adding the following provision:
25	Section 7. In any case in which the Senate Constitution or the Operations Manua
26	requires a supermajority vote of the entire membership of the Faculty Senate
27	(whether or not present) for approval of a matter, the President of the Senate may
28	take the vote by a mail ballot if the Senate so orders.

c) that the Senate recommends that a new provision be added to the end of the University clinical track policy providing as follows:
"This policy may not be revised or amended without a 3/5 affirmative vote of the entire membership of the Faculty Senate whether or not present at the time of the consideratio of any proposed revision or amendment."
d) that the Senate's approval of any part of this resolution is conditioned on the successful implementation of ALL parts of this resolution, and that the proposed changes in the Senate Constitution should be presented to the Board of Regents simultaneously with the proposed changes in the Clinical Track Policy.

Motion to amend the resolution relating to clinical track promotion criteria, adopted at the April 4, 2000 meeting of the Senate, by adding the following paragraph C to that motion, so that the motion will read as follows (new language highlighted): Resolved that the Senate recommends that By July 1, 2001, or prior to expansion of the clinical track beyond 30%, whichever comes first, each college of the University having a clinical track policy using its usual governance procedures and with approval of the Provost adopt and/or revise its clinical track promotion policies to clearly indicate: A. How "a record of professional productivity beyond clinical service" and "unmistakable evidence of recognition by peers," as required for promotion by the clinical track policy to the rank of Associate Professor or Professor, is to be demonstrated, and B. The types of activities that will evidence professional productivity sufficient for promotion to each rank. C. How the type and/or nature of the activities evidencing professional productivity sufficient for promotion on the clinical track differs from the type and/or nature of the activities required for promotion on the tenure track.
