Similarly, seek, evaluate, and select candidates for extra-University teaching awards, including U.S. Professor of the Year.  (c) Advise on development of proposals for outside funding to support curricular development, equipment for teaching, and any other proposals related to the teaching and learning effort of the University;  (d) Advise with respect to the policies, priorities, and procedures on:  (i) evaluation of teaching and learning, including codes of teaching responsibilities;  (ii) University-wide experimental or nontraditional education programs;  (iii) the method, time, and efficiency of registration;  (iv) the conduct of convocations and commencements; and (v) the University calendar.
