For the first time, the President will attend and provide the opening remarks for the Outstanding TA award ceremony We plan to have working groups over the summer to: 1) Change the president and provost's teaching award categories and evaluation criterion to match the new faculty structure (faculty of practice, faculty of instruction, clinical faculty and tenure-track faculty. 2) In the last several years with creation of the technology and teaching awards in the Office of Teaching Learning and Technology, our submission for the instructional improvement

	award have significantly decreased. The OTLT awards are for far more money than we can offer and overlap significantly with the criterion for the instructional improvement awards. We plan to suspend the current award and consider alternatives for this award money such as supporting faculty to present on teaching at conferences, etc.
