Current Year Activities	Reviewed the responsibilities of the Department of Public Safety by comparing the Department of Justice Campus Law Enforcement Survey practices with UI practices and by touring the department, courtesy of Officer McKenna, and viewing a video on their services. Advised on education programs by lending support and hearing about the panel on "Sexual Misconduct: a coordinated response to student's

	reports"; engaging the Director of Women's Resource and Action Center in a discussion about the use of technology in stalking; and supporting the "It's On Us" pledge drive. The committee also engaged in discussion and offered input to the strategic plan, in particular related to community engagement activities.
	Advised on policies and procedures by learning about the Clery Act.
	Advised on processes for minimizing the likelihood of emergencies by becoming informed of the VP for Student Services and UISG initiative to purchase the Lifeline Response App. The cost benefit of such purchase rests with UISG and they have decided not to pursue. The committee also met with University of Iowa Emergency Medical Services Student Interest Organization (UIEMS) and offered to write a letter of support for their organization offering emergency medical services on campus.
	Reviewed agreements and collaborations with non-University law enforcement agencies by engaging personnel from Iowa City Police Department in a discussion about security coordination for political events.
Topics your committee anticipates addressing during the coming year	Focus on needs assessment to help carry out the charge of the committee. Specifically on this potential topics: UI EMS endorsement; Nite Ride; campus policies on stalking, domestic violence, and sexual assault.
Other issues of concern	Student participation was not consistent and one member dropped from the committee before we met. UISG did not respond with a replacement.

There is preparatory work to be done ahead of each meeting as well as minimal communication and follow-up via email between meetings.
