	This year the committee focused on assessing campus climate from the key stakeholders at the UI (faculty, staff, graduate students, undergraduate students, and professional students).
Current Year Activities	The committee worked with the CDO and the Provost's Office to create and administer a new faculty and staff survey on diversity, equity, and inclusion. The survey took place January 18 – February 28.
	The committee also worked with the Office of Assessment to include additional DEI items on the undergraduate and graduate SERU surveys, which were administered March - May 2018.
	In addition to the survey-based assessment of campus climate, the committee organized and facilitated strategic listening sessions for faculty and staff to gain greater insight into the experiences of faculty and staff, and to gather ideas for how the UI could do better in regards to enhancing diversity, equity, and inclusion on campus.
	The committee then worked on developing a plan for disseminating survey and listening session results, which will be available in Fall 2018.
	Subcommittees also partnered with Sarah to help finalize a student climate report that utilizes past and current Student Experience in the Research University (SERU) data. This report will also be released in Fall 2018.
	Other activities included opening a committee email account, improving communication channels for faculty, staff, and students to submit feedback and ideas to the committee, and discussing possible projects for future committees to work on.
