	Members of the Parking Services staff would periodically attend meetings to apprise the committee of updates to parking rules and regulations. Our committee was kept abreast of changes made to parking areas as well given the massive amounts of construction happening on campus and throughout the community that impacted UI faculty/staff parking assignments.
Topics your committee anticipates addressing during the coming year	Annual review of parking violation "hot spots". Continual conversation about signage, is it appropriate, is it enough, etc.? Best ways for the parking office to communicate to faculty and staff about construction impacting parking spaces. Continue to enforce employee parking restrictions in Hospital Ramps 1,2 and 4 – these are for patients and visitors – not for employees.
Other issues of concern	None at this time.
What should we tell applicants for this committee regarding expectations of members (anticipated workload, existence of subcommittees, etc.)?	Committee members should plan to meet from 2 to 2.5 hours per month, sometimes more when extra monthly meeting are necessary. It is important that committee members are able to attend meetings as we need to have at least three members present to hear cases. Committee members should become familiar with the campus parking map and parking regulations (review the handouts given at every meeting). The committee hears and adjudicates anywhere from 40 to 50 appeals monthly.
