Advise on rules and regulations and fee schedules pertaining to all modes of campus parking and transportation, including priorities, registrations, and penalties for violations; e. Advise on procedure for handling appeals of fines arising from alleged violations of traffic or parking regulations; f. Advise in developing and reviewing plans for coordinating University transportation and facilities with those of city, county, state, and federal agencies.
