Current Year Activities	Committee members spent the first two meetings being immersed in the activities of the Financial Aid office, learning about the Federal Guidelines that the University must adhere to in dispensing financial aid, understanding the complex decisions and timelines surrounding dispersal of aid, who qualifies, etc. Critical to understanding financial aid is the interplay and relationship with awarding scholarships/grants and the work study program. Members also learned about campus data collection to document students' understanding of financial aid.	

	Members read materials supplied by the Financial Aid office to better understand trends in financial aid and the way financial aid is supported/funded on campus. At the December meeting Members were consulted and reviewed documents that propose changes made by the FA office to procedures for awarding financial aid including revisions to how students/families are notified. In January 2020 the FA office moved to the 2 nd Floor of the Old Capitol Mall. The Committee meetings were moved to the FA Office Space so members could observe the way offices are arranged to allow for student privacy when meeting with counselors. The student co-chairs presented a program they proposed for implementation in Fall '20 to create greater student awareness of financial aid while discovering what undergrads know/don't know about financial aid. At the February 28 th meeting, revised plans for helping student become more aware of FA were discussed. To complement the FA Open House (March 10 th), there was discussion of partnering with UISG to increase student awareness of FA. The FA office contracts with a national organization of Financial Aid Advisors to evaluate the University's compliance with Dept of Education regulations and members reviewed specific elements of the survey and proposed a more expansive internal survey for campus use. Because of COVID, the March meeting was cancelled. Members met in June 2020 to devise a list of continuing topics for discussion by the 2020-21 Committee members.	
Topics your committee anticipates addressing during the coming year	Members of the 2019-20 committee responded favorably to a partnership effort with UISG and the FA office to more fully acquaint students with FA programming. This discussion will continue. Members will continue discussion on the internal survey to be designed/implemented by FA Staff and with support from UISG. The purpose is to better understand how to get financial aid information to students who qualify but are not applying. Because demographic estimations suggest that enrollment patterns will shift, the FAA will continue to discuss the vital role the FA Office on campus.	
Other issues of concern	Student members of the FA committee advocated for effective use of social media to recruit interested members and to inform current members of topics of discussion. This discussion was shared with members of the Shared Governance Review team during the March meeting. We recommend changes in the way social media is made available to the work of Faculty/Staff/Student committees to promote wider discussions and increase interest.

Consistent attendance is important for the functioning of this committee. The committee co-chairs anticipate the work of sub-committees assuming a greater role in 2020-21. Please consider joining this committee if you are interested in policy related to financial aid and learning more about the complex system of supporting students who rely on financial aid to attend the University. Attendance during the 2019-20 session was impressive. We'll continue to work toward strong and engaged attendance in the coming year.
