Current Year Activities	The work of the Non-Resident Fee Review Committee begins after a student who has been classified as a Nonresident for tuition purposes by the Office of the Registrar submits a letter of appeal. Staff in the Office of the Registrar compile each student's documentation and letter of appeal. Appeal packets are distributed electronically to Committee members for review prior to scheduled meetings. Each student is invited to attend the appeals meeting and
