

Some quick facts about Faculty Senate

- Senate is the representative body for the faculty of the University of Iowa. Membership is about 80 faculty members—from ten colleges and across all tracks—each year. A term is three years.
- Faculty Council is the executive body of the Faculty Senate and is comprised of approximately 20 Senators.
- There are 4 Faculty Senate officers: the <u>President</u>, the <u>Vice President</u>, the <u>Secretary</u>, and the <u>Past</u> President.
- Faculty Senate is an advisory body that influences University decisions that affect faculty.

Recent Highlights

- Faculty Senate approved major changes to the <u>Instructional Track Policy</u> and the <u>faculty dispute</u> <u>procedures</u> in the Policy Manual.
- Faculty Senate approved policies for the creation of Research Track faculty positions in the College of Engineering and the College of Education.
- The President of Faculty Senate co-signed a <u>letter</u>, along with the President and Provost, affirming the University's commitment to protecting the academic freedom of faculty members.
- There were numerous visitors to the Faculty Senate who shared important information, including
 resources for childcare, support available from the Provost's Office, Together Hawkeyes
 Campaign, and our university membership to the Small-Town & Rural Students (STARS) College
 Network.
- A Faculty Council and University Administration Retreat was held on August 21, 2024, that featured presentations and discussion on current perceptions of higher education, with a focus on messaging, community engagement, and shared governance.
