

MOTION SUMMARY

Faculty Senate – Tuesday, September 17, 2024

Professor Koch moved and Professor Farag seconded that the University Safety and Security Charter Committee be dissolved. The motion carried unanimously.

The [Campus Safety Board](#), with much wider representation from across campus, has taken on the role once played by the University Safety and Security Charter Committee. The Campus Safety Board continues to meet twice per year to review safety data, assess the effectiveness of current measures, and recommend improvements.

Professor McQuistan moved and Professor Koch seconded that the Recreational Services Charter Committee be disbanded in favor of replacing it with an annual meeting with shared governance leaders. The motion carried unanimously.
